As you are aware, I own a piece of property next to Precision National Plating in Clarks Summit. My wife and I have decided to put a modular home on that property. We have picked out the home and we are ready to get the permit for the construction phase.

The EPA and DEP have expressed concerns with the ground water contamination caused by the past disposal practices of Precision. It would seem as though they are not confident in the polysulfide injection process that was supposed to stop the migration of the large plume of contamination caused by your client, Precision.

When I purchased the property I was under the impression the polysulfide injection process was going to stabilize the hexavalent chromium and change the hexavalent chromium to a harmless trivalent state. It would seem as though this process failed.

I only have two alternatives for providing my property with water:

1. Drill a deep well and pray the contamination from the Precision site does not migrate into my well or contaminate the deep aquifer.
2. Have the water line extended to this property at Precision's expense.

I would greatly appreciate your efforts to persuade Precision to commit to extending the water line, as this would provide the most good for the greatest number of people.

Time truly is of the essence. I hope to hear from you by 9-4-09, as I feel that with your knowledge of the area and influence with the company we can resolve this in a fair and reasonable manner. If you are unable to expedite this, I will contact Stinnes Corporation, the parent company of Precision, directly to see if they can resolve this matter expeditiously.
