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Mr. Jennings,

Because Ann is consumed with reviewing and editing the EE/CA in order for it to be ready for release next week, I will respond to your email on her behalf.

1. The public meeting is scheduled to take place on Tuesday, Dec. 7, 2010 at 7:00 PM, at the Clarks Summit Fire Company. My understanding is that an ad should be placed in the paper later this week announcing the meeting and the opening of the public comment period.

2. As Ann stated in her email, dated Nov. 2, 2010, the EE/CA will be available to the public on Nov. 23, 2010. Ann also stated in her Nov. 2 email that the EE/CA will be available at the Abington Community Library, the township office, as well as the Precision OSC website.

3. Ann has informed me that the 589,000 ppb for SB25 was not the highest recorded value at the Site. Ann said that in the past, one other well recorded a higher value (in the '70s), and 3 other wells have recorded values exceeding and around 550,000 ppb (based upon Precision's data). Ann cannot scrutinize the EPA data at this time, since she is working to get the EE/CA finalized for next week. This data should be included in the EE/CA.

4. Sections 300.415(n)(4)(iv) and 300.820(a)(2) of Title 40 of the Code of Federal Regulations state that EPA shall prepare a written response to **significant** comments submitted during the public comment period.

5. As for when "a plan will be implemented," I stated in my email to Malcolm MacGregor, dated September 20, 2010, and copied to the Township Supervisors on September 21, 2010, the following:

"Pursuant to 40 C.F.R. §§ 300.415(n)(4)(iv) and 300.820(a), once the public comment period has closed, EPA will review all of the comments submitted and prepare a written response to significant comments. This process can be very time intensive depending on the number and complexity of the comments. If the comment period closes the [third] week in December, and there has not been a request for an extension of the comment period, the written response to significant comments will not be completed until [February] at the earliest.

After EPA has reviewed all the comments and issued its written response to significant comments, it will prepare and issue an Action Memorandum, selecting the response action for the Site. The Action Memorandum will select the response actions that must be taken to address the soil and groundwater contamination at the Site. However, it is important to note that, based upon comments received, it is possible that EPA's selected response action could differ from the preferred alternative set forth in the EE/CA.

After the Action Memorandum is issued, EPA will negotiate an agreement with Precision to perform the Work set forth in the Action Memorandum. However, as you know Malcolm, negotiations could take several months before an agreement is reached for the performance of the work. I am laying out the timeline once again so that the Supervisors understand that although the EE/CA will in fact be finalized this fall, the response action selected in the Action Memorandum will not begin before the end of the year. Of course, completion will

depend on the selected response action."
